Membership

The Rudolf Steiner Library is a national, mail-order lending library. The library has over 25,000 volumes covering the full spectrum of western and eastern spirituality, and multimedia offerings as well. Members of the Anthroposophical Society in America are automatically members of the library; non-members are welcome to join for \$20 a year, plus a one-time, refundable \$25 deposit.

Special Collections for Teachers

The library makes a special effort to acquire books of particular interest to teachers and home-schooling parents, including materials on pedagogy and curriculum, child development, the effects of television and computers, fairy tales, and more.

Catalogs

The library has 26 sections, and each has its own catalog. These can be ordered separately for \$2 each. For a complete listing of subjects, call the library and request a brochure. Some of the largest and most widely used catalogs are General Anthroposophy, Christian Thought and Mysticism, Education, Fairy Tales and Folklore, Goethe, Philosophy, and Rudolf Steiner: The Man and His Work.

Newsletter

The library's newsletter is a highly respected publication that appears three to four times yearly. Critical essays, annotations, and reviews inform readers about the library's collection and new acquisitions. The newsletter is between 25 and 35 pages per issue.
